Two Recent Books by Thomas Mann. By Dr. Edward F. Hauch, Visiting Professor of German and an outstanding American scholar of Germanic studies. For many years he was Head of the Department of German at Hamilton College.

FEBRUARY 17—Tuesday 7:30 P.M.

Enchanting Spain. Illustrated lecture by Miss Marjorie S. Judy, Instructor in Modern Languages, who has lived in Cuba many years and traveled through Spain last summer. Miss Judy is well informed on Hispanic life.

MARCH 10—Tuesday 7:30 P.M.

Present-Day Italy. Illustrated lecture by Mrs. Azzurra B. Givens, Instructor in Modern Languages, a native Italian and honor graduate of the University of Florence. She is well qualified to discuss developments in post-war Italy.

APRIL 14—Tuesday 7:30 P.M.

Traditional Nicaragua. Illustrated lecture by Dr. Heberto Lacayo, Associate Professor of Spanish, a native of Nicaragua, who has been engaged in linguistic research there the past two summers.

MAY 12—Tuesday 7:30 P.M.

The France I Love. Illustrated lecture by Miss Roberta Ackerman, Instructor in Modern Languages, who spent the school year '50-'51 on a return visit to France. She has had the opportunity to study France and her people at close range.
