Work in the various study groups will consist of discussions of general education problems. In order to keep the groups at manageable sizes attendance will, of necessity, have to be limited. Already most of these sections are quite large. Admission to these groups is only upon the recommendation of deans, department heads, and general education chairmen. Upon receipt of these recommendations the General Education Office issues written assignments to individuals to the various study groups. If you have not yet been assigned to a study group and wish to be, please see that a recommendation in your behalf reaches the General Education Office immediately. (Most of these assignments have already been made.)

Two further points concerning study groups. First, if you expect to participate in these activities will you please identify yourself only with the study group of your choice and stay with that group. Participants are asked not to "visit" from group to group during the conference. Second, if you cannot attend the sessions of your study group regularly will you please consider yourself an observer rather than an active participant.

All FSU faculty members who attend any portion of the Conference--even if only a single lecture--are urged to register. Registration will (1) complete our records, (2) entitle you to a packet of Conference materials, and (3) entitle you to a copy of the Proceedings of the Conference which will be issued later. Therefore, **PLEASE REGISTER!**

We trust you will have a profitable experience during the Conference.

* Please note that the opening and closing sessions will be held in Longmire Auditorium rather than Music Hall as indicated in the program. Music Hall is not yet ready for use.
