I came here to London with a children's transport and was so lucky to meet up with Ulli. She is in the same grade as I and also sleeps in the same hall only at the far end. It is very good here. Time is scheduled by the minute. I hardly understand any English, therefore didn't have to take the exams last week and was allowed to read (during that time). Grading here is like this: they go up to 70, 80, 90 to 100 but one also says Honors, praised etc on the way down. Also one is judged as best or lowest. After lunch we always go for an hour walk in a very beautiful park, and after dinner we have gym except for Monday and Thursday when we bathe (swim?) and then we have gym in the afternoon. Sometimes we play ball in the afternoon outdoors. We have religion and singing almost daily. Saturdays are free days here and if weather permits, we take the school bus in the morning to our country house "Elstrif" and stay there till late afternoon. We eat cold food in the out-of-doors. We have been there twice already and each time, just as we started to play, it began to rain. We can also swim there in the summer and ride a donkey. The upper classes can play hockey, tennis and roller skating. Great, don't you think? Now I really can't think of any more.
