"F. S. U. on Parade" - November 13 and 14, 1959!

How long has it been since you visited the campus? Six months? Six years? Twenty years? Regardless of how long it has been, a visit will leave you amazed at the progress taking place almost daily. Progress, which, added to the traditions and standards set by you as a former student, is helping to make Florida State an even greater University.

Do plan to attend Homecoming 1959. November 13 and 14 will be the ideal time for you to really see "F. S. U. on Parade".

The big week end begins with the Homecoming parade at 3:30 p.m. on Friday, November 13. During registration, 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Friday and 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. Saturday, you will be served coffee and light refreshments in the large lounge of Longmire Building, and there will be friends and former classmates on hand to greet you. Be sure to come by to register, pick up your tickets and greet old friends. Better still, make the Longmire Building your headquarters and "meeting place" during all of Homecoming.

Let us urge you to attend the Garnet and Gold Key banquet Friday at 6 p.m. in the Suwannee Room. It is at this informal banquet (open to all alumni and their guests) that Dr. Strozier speaks informally to the alumni. Dr. Strozier will also, at this time, make the formal announcement concerning the naming of buildings on campus. Mr. and Mrs. Kellum, Dean Sandels, and the families of Dean Dorman and Dr. Montgomery will be special guests at the banquet. This dinner will adjourn in plenty of time for you to attend the Pow Wow in Campbell Stadium at 8 p.m.

Saturday's activities begin with the alumni breakfast at 8 a.m. in the Suwannee Room. The annual business meeting of the Alumni Association follows in this location at 9 a.m. After the business meeting, those reuniting classes so desiring, will have opportunity to hold special class meetings in the Longmire Building.

From 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. Saturday morning you will have the pleasure of visiting informally with Dr. and Mrs. Strozier as they again open their home to returning alumni.

Dedicatory services will be held at Kellum Building at 11:10, Dorman Hall at 11:20, Montgomery Building (formerly known as Women's Gym) at 11:30 and at Sandels Building at 11:40, with these buildings remaining open from 11 a.m. to 12 noon. The TV Station and Nuclear Radiation Center will have open house from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.

That famous FSU barbecue will be served at Tully Gym from 12:30 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. The football game with William and Mary follows at 2:30 at the stadium. Of course, the Marching Chiefs will have another outstanding half-time show for us.

The faculty and alumni want a chance to visit, so, the faculty will be on hand in the Longmire Building from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Saturday for a Faculty-Alumni Reception. This will be the opportunity for faculty and alumni to relax and enjoy an informal visit.

The climax of Homecoming will be the dance in Tully Gym at 9 p.m. with music by Ralph Marterie.

Enclosed is a list of various motels and hotels so that you can make your housing reservations direct. Write early to get in the motel or hotel of your choice. Also enclosed is a Homecoming program. COMPLETE THE ENCLOSED RESERVATIONS ENVELOPE, INCLUDE YOUR CHECK MADE PAYABLE TO FSU ALUMNI ASSOCIATION TO COVER COSTS OF TICKETS DESIRED, AND GET IT BACK TO THE ALUMNI OFFICE BY NOVEMBER 6, 1959. AFTER THIS DATE, NO RESERVATIONS MAY BE CHANGED OR REFUNDS MADE. ALL TICKETS WILL BE HELD FOR YOU TO PICK UP AT THE REGISTRATION DESK DURING THE SCHEDULED REGISTRATION PERIODS UNLESS YOU SPECIFY OTHERWISE NOT LATER THAN NOVEMBER 6, 1959.
