Mrs. Roy Bryant Her Husband Indicted

2 Indicted In the Death Of Youth, 14

SUMNER, MISS., Sept. 6—(AP)—An all-white grand jury indicted two white men Tuesday on charges of kidnaping and murdering Emmett Louis Till, 14-year-old Negro boy from Chicago who allegedly whistled at a white woman.

Roy Bryant and J. W. Milam, his half-brother, pleaded innocent when arraigned a few hours later. Judge Curtis Swango, Jr., said he will set the trial date Thursday.

Sheriff H. C. Strider said, "We expect to try them in this term of court." The three-week term began Monday.

The men did not ask for bond because of the nearness of the trial.

Murder carries a maximum penalty of death in Mississippi's gas chamber. Minimum sentence is life in prison. The kidnaping statute carries a maximum term of 10 years in prison.

Body Found in River

Till's body, a bullet in his head and a 100-pound cotton gin fan tied to his neck to weight him down, was pulled from the Tallahatchie River last Wednesday.

The boy was kidnaped three days earlier from his uncle's home where he was spending a short vacation.

Young Till allegedly whistled or made ugly remarks to Mrs. Bryant, wife of a storekeeper at the town of Money.

George Smith, sheriff of Leflore County, said the men admitted taking Till from his uncle's home but said they released him unharmed.
