### Additional Information

Seventy-five rooms have been reserved at the Huntsville Hilton Hotel (Tel. AC 205-533-1400) at a discount rate of \$19.00 per single room and \$24.00 for double accommodations. Other hotels/motels at approximately the same rates are: Holiday Inn, University Drive; Sheraton Motor Inn, University Drive; Carriage Inn, University Drive. All are within ten minutes driving distance of the Huntsville Hilton.

Huntsville has a modern "Jetplex" airport serviced by United, Eastern and Southern Airlines. The University will provide hourly transportation from the "Jetplex" to the Hilton from 2:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. on February 17 and 8:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. on February 18. Free return transportation will be furnished February 19 from 12:00 noon until 5:00 p.m.

### Special Events

**Ante-Bellum Tour:** There will be a spouses/dependents tour of three Ante-Bellum homes in Huntsville Friday afternoon, February 18 from 2:00 until 5:00 p.m. One admission of \$1.00 per person is inclusive of the three homes, transportation and refreshments. Departure from the Hilton will be 2:00 p.m.

**Free Concerts:** Following the banquet address, "An Eighteenth Century Musicals" will be offered by the UAH Department of Music.
