## HOUSING

Individuals should make their own housing arrangements. There will be room for the first 125 persons who desire to stay in Pleasant Hall, LSU's Continuing Education Center. Room rates are indicated on the attached reservation form. If you want to share a room, please indicate on the form whether or not you have someone in mind to room with (give full name).

The closest motel to LSU is the Prince Murat Inn, located at 1480 Nicholson Drive (2 miles northwest of the campus). Until January 20th this motel will reserve rooms for the Consortium for \$18.50 per double room and \$14.50 per single, plus tax. To get this rate, be sure to mention your affiliation with the Consortium.

National chains with accommodations convenient to LSU by car include (in order of increasing distance from the campus): Rodeway, Travelodge, Sheraton, Hilton, Howard Johnson, Days Inn (Port Allen), and Holiday Inn South.
